**Dr. Smith** received his doctorate from the University of Chicago and since 1984 has taught at Yale, where he also co-directs the Center for the Study of Representative Institutions. His research focuses on the history of political philosophy with special attention to the problem of the ancients and moderns, the relation of religion and politics, and theories of representative government. His best-known publications include *Hegel’s Critique of Liberalism* (1989), *Spinoza, Liberalism, and Jewish Identity* (1997), *Spinoza’s Book of Life* (2003), *Reading Leo Strauss* (2006), *The Cambridge Companion to Leo Strauss* (2009), *Political Philosophy* (2012), *Modernity and its Discontents* (2016), and *Reclaiming Patriotism in an Age of Extremes* (2021).
